
## Resident Minister Rev. Matt Hamasaki



In March, on the third, Hinamatsuri is celebrated in Japan and those observing Japanese culture. Hinamatsuri literally means "doll festival" but is often translated as Girls' Day or Dolls' Day. It's held on this day because the odd numbers were thought to be auspicious, and with the same odd number, it's even more special!

The dolls were thought to have the ability to take bad spirits with them and so the original festival saw the dolls placed in a river where they would float away along with the participant's bad luck. Over time, the dolls became more of the centerpiece of the festival and instead of sending them away, the dolls were put up as decoration at home. Initially they were made of paper and straw, but now are made of much more elaborate materials. Still, the ability to take away bad spirits remains with the dolls, so it is imperative that the family take them down when Hinamatsuri is over. The focus has become the girls in the family, hoping for them to grow up healthy.

As with most holidays, there are traditional foods that come along with Hinamatsuri. One of the kinds that I had as a child was Hina Arare. Many of you may be familiar with arare, rice crackers that are made from rice flour. Hina Arare is special in that while arare traditionally does not have any color, Hina Arare is coated with sugar (which makes it sweeter) and is brightly colored for the festival.

The colors come in sets of either four or three. The four-colored set has pink (representing spring), green (representing summer), yellow (representing fall), and (Continued on page 2)

Thanks to all of your generous donations and memberships, the temple has stayed financially sound through our COVID times. We are still hoping to move forward to more of a normal atmosphere around the temple. Your diligence to get vaccinations and follow protocols has allowed us to keep our doors open.

The first week of March brings with it the annual Buddhist Churches of America (BCA) National Council Meeting. This year it will again be held virtually from the Central District, which is the area around Fresno. The Zoom meeting format has allowed each temple to save money during these challenging times because there is no need to pay for travel and lodging for the delegates sent to represent each temple. In the past, these expenses could be \$1,000 or possibly more per person because delegates would be attending for multiple days. This virtual meeting costs the temple \$35 per person and still allows us to take care of business that affects all the temples in BCA. I will be attending to represent the Sacramento Betsuin, as will Reverend Matt and Karen Adachi, our president-elect. We will be sharing information from the meeting with all of you in coming issues of the Sangha.

I know how much we have all been missing the times when we would gather together at the Betsuin, and especially those times when we could gather for DELICIOUS FOOD! Whether that was for Bazaar, or teriyaki beef sandwich or ABA/SBWA fundraisers, or goodies provided by Reiko and her crew in the courtyard after Sunday services, WE MISS IT ALL. Well, I am happy to share with you that on Sunday, April 10, Dale Louie & Crew will be having a Hawaiian Breakfast Fundraiser to benefit the temple's General Fund (Thank you Dale!)
